Mystic Mirrors

Mirrors have been known to accomplish optical illusion, but Bernard Pictet uses decorative glass with mirrors to create dramatic optical effects the studio calls kinetic glass. Seamlessly incorporating magnifying mirrors into plain, mirrored surfaces, it produces large surfaces of glass with magnifying properties. These glass effects can be incorporated into mirror glass for wall panels, or translucent glass for partitions. Each magnifying element can be cut into any form measuring up to 1,050 x 1,400 mm, or several elements can be "tiled" to form large surfaces and the joints concealed by small mirrored strips.
